Hillel Yeshiva High School is a coeducational, Jewish Orthodox, dual-curriculum school, committed to providing its students with an excellent education in both Judaic and General Studies. The school aims to produce ethically sensitive young men and women who are engaged in the world around them and possess the skills, knowledge, and understanding needed to make a significant contribution to the Jewish, American, and global communities in which they live.

Academic Profile 2011-2012

I. Community

Hillel Yeshiva High School (established in September 1983), located in Ocean, New Jersey, is about 55 miles from New York City and serves as a regional Yeshiva High School for Central New Jersey.

II. School Characteristics

Hillel Yeshiva High School, a private community school with a population of 200 students in grades 9-12, draws from a wide range of students from various municipalities in New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania. Tuition subventions for needy students are available.

The faculty consists of 35 men and women, 80% of whom have earned a Master's Degree or higher. 15% of the faculty hold Doctoral degrees.

The school year, consisting of a minimum of 170 days, is divided into three semesters. The school day runs from 8:00AM to 5:00PM Monday-Thursday and from 8:00AM to 1:30PM on Friday.

The GPA is calculated at the end of each year and updated after the first trimester of the 12th grade. The GPA is based on all credited courses.

Hillel Yeshiva High School does not compute rank. Experience has taught us that with such a small, select group of students, rank is often misleading. Infinitesimal differences in GPA often lead to considerable rank differences. The transcript indicates course levels by “R” (regular), “H” (Honors), “HH” (High Honors), and “AP” (Advanced Placement). Only High Honors and Advanced Placement courses are weighted.

IV. Curriculum Features

The school provides a dual college preparatory program for all students, which includes 15 hours of Judaic Studies per week. In addition to the required core general studies subjects, Hillel Yeshiva offers numerous High Honors (HH) and Advanced Placement (AP) courses. AP courses available presently are Biology, Chemistry, American History, US Government and Politics, Calculus, English Language, English Literature, Physics, Psychology, and Computer Science. Please note that the maximum number of AP courses a student may take are limited to three courses during 11th grade and three courses during 12th grade.

V. National Honor Society

Membership in Hillel Yeshiva’s Segula Chapter of the National Honor Society is based on a minimum grade point average of 88, strong leadership, and community service involvement.
